Pastor's Message:

DAYS FULL OF SORROW, JOY

Days are full of sorrow. Days are full of joy. I prefer the latter. "The days of our years are threescore years and ten; and if by reason of strength they be fourscore years, yet is their strength labor and sorrow; for it is soon cut off, and we fly away" (Psalm 90:10). Davs are full of "labor and sorrow"that's the Biblical reality. Moses, the writer of this Psalm, knew it full well. He spent 40 years in Egypt as a prince. But another 40 years in the Midian desert as an outcast! And then, yet another 40 years leading over a million Jews out of slavery.

Days are full of sorrow. Moses ought to know. He wrote Genesis. "And the Lord God said unto the serpent, Because thou hast done this, thou art cursed above all cattle, and above every beast of the field; upon thy belly shalt thou go, and dust shalt thou eat all the days of thy life: And I will put enmity between thee and the woman, and between thy seed and her seed; it shall bruise thy

head, and thou shalt bruise his heel. Unto the woman [God] said, I will greatly multiply thy sorrow and thy conception; in sorrow thou shalt bring forth children; and thy desire shall be to thy husband, and he shall rule over thee. And unto Adam he said. Because thou hast hearkened unto the voice of thy wife, and hast eaten of the tree, of which I commanded thee, saying, Thou shalt not eat of it: cursed is the ground for thy sake; in sorrow shalt thou eat of it all the days of thy life; Thorns also and thistles shall it bring forth to thee; and thou shalt eat the herb of the field: In the sweat of thy face shalt thou eat bread, till thou return unto the ground; for out of it wast thou taken: for dust thou art, and unto dust shalt thou return" (3:14-21). Cursed. Enmity. Sorrow. Thorns. Thistles. Dust. I told you days are full of sorrow!

But days are full of joy—is what we all prefer! Another Psalmist said "Thou wilt shew me the path of life:



Days Full of Sorrow, Joy

In thy presence is fulness of joy; At thy right hand there are pleasures for evermore" (A Michtam of David, Psalm 16:11). Yes, that's what we all prefer! Whereas Moses highlights days full of sorrow, David highlights days full of joy. However. Moses does record the antidote for Serpent-Crusher. sends sorrow. God the Ironically, He is called a man of sorrow; but He is the antidote for sorrow because He absorbed all our sorrow in order to give us the fulness of joy and pleasures for evermore! (See Isaiah 53, John 10:10 and 15:11.) Jesus said to His disciples, "your sorrow shall be turned into joy" (John 16:20). You gotta have Jesus then, right? Right. If you've never had an opportunity to know who He really is and what He has done for sinners like you, then now is the time to find out. He is the Serpent-Crusher whom God promised to send in Genesis 3:15. He is the one who absorbed the curse and the sorrow given to Adam and Eve and us, their descendants. Jesus Christ is the second Adam who has perfectly obeyed God in all His commandments. He is the one who has turned His disciples' sorrow into joy!

You can find Jesus in the pages of Scripture. In fact, you can start reading the book of John.
