

All About Attitude

"The way you say 'representative' to an automated system reflects the real you," a friend told me. After we laughed at that truth, I realized everything I say matters. Someone is always listening, whether the words and tone are positive or negative.

Ephesians 4:29 (KJV) says our language shouldn't be "corrupt" but good, edifying. Whether I'm peaceful, hurried, joyful, empathetic, frustrated, celebrating or hurting, I can carefully choose my words (and the attitude behind them). When I'm not ready to speak wholesomely, may God shut my mouth. When a friend needs encouragement, may I listen to God's prompting. When I need to confront, may I do so lovingly.

Changing how we think — that is, how we speak to ourselves — can be tough. But God wants to transform our reactions and motives, dispelling pride, a lack of confidence and anxiety. In this new year:

- I'm alone can become God is with me.
- I can't do this can become Anything is possible with God.
- I'm failing can become Just because I'm struggling, it doesn't mean I'm failing.
- I'm not enough can become I'm God's beloved child.

spiritually! Make everything possible in your life, in your work, so that you're able to come to all Sunday dinners of the spiritual food of the Word of God! If you're traveling, make sure you're at a biblical church service! If you have to work on Sunday, then make sure to catch the sermon online (YouTube.com/@rbchurch). Do it right away. The sermon online may be like a microwave dinner; but it's better to have a microwave dinner than to have nothing at all for your spiritual feeding!

Moreover, a number of you have come to me and said, you know Pastor, it's so much better to be in-person for church services! And so, I agree with you. We're thankful for the online technology because we have church family members that just can't make it to in-person services, like our dear sister Betty who is 98 years old as we speak!

Another hopeful and prayerful expectation I have for 2025 is: that we, as a local church, would practice nouthetic counseling one with another. Nouthetic is a fancy word for biblical counseling. You may say, Why did you use it? To get your attention, that's why! Why are you using a fancy word? It's all Greek to me! To test your attitude how godly you'd react to something 'new.' To challenge you and stretch you. Or would you rather stay comfortable in your current stage of Christian growth? You need to grow up, you know? The Apostle Peter said, "grow in grace, and in the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To Him be glory both now and for ever. Amen."

You're right, nouthetic is Greek. Look at 1 Thessalonians 5:14. Paul commends them for comforting themselves together and edifying one another; building up one another! And then he uses the word "warn them that are unruly" within the confines of their local church. To warn is from the Greek word noutheteow, which means "impart understanding," "to set right," "to lay on the heart", "to admonish," "to warn," "to remind," and "to correct." This is the idea of biblical counseling; to correct one another's wrong by the standard of the Scripture!

Anyway, I have more hopeful and prayerful expectations as we set foot into 2025. Of course, we do not assume God is going to automatically allow us to do that. Our attitude is: we'll do this, we'll do that, God willing! Pastor James corrects us, "Go to now, ye that say, To day or to morrow we will go into such a city, and continue there a year, and buy and sell, and get gain: Whereas ye know not what shall be on the morrow. For what is your life? It is even a vapour, that appeareth for a little time, and then vanisheth away. For that ye ought to say, If the Lord will, we shall live, and do this, or that" (4:13-15). So, I say, Lord willing, we shall set foot into 2025 with great expectations!
