## Pastor's Message: THE FOUNDATION OF OUR JOY PART 1

Not too long ago, I asked you a very important question-Where can you find joy? "Not in unbelief-Voltaire was an infidel of the most pronounced type. He wrote: I wish I had never been born. Not in pleasure—Lord Byron lived a life of worldly pleasure if anyone did. He wrote: The worm, the canker, and grief are mine alone. Not in money-Jay Gould, the American millionaire, had plenty of that. When dying, he said: I suppose I am the most miserable man on earth. Not in position and fame—Lord Beaconsfield enjoyed more than his share of both. He wrote: Youth is a mistake: manhood a struggle; old age a regret. Not in military glory—Alexander the Great conquered the known world in his day. Having done so, he wept in his tent, because he said, There are no more worlds to conquer. Where then is joy found?—the answer is simple, in Christ alone" (Paul Lee Tan, Encyclopedia of 7700 Illustrations).

I'd like to expand on that simple answer. True joy is found in Christ alone because of His prayer to the Father in John 17:13, "But now I am coming to you, and these things I speak in the world, that they may

have **my joy** fulfilled in themselves." This is the same "joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God" (Hebrews 12:2).

One pastor puts it this way: "The ultimate source of Jesus' joy in doing his Father's will is seeing the Father's glory and being glorified with the Father. The perfect obedience of the Son is sustained by the joy that is set before Him (Heb. 12:2), and that joy was his return to the Father (see John 17:5). So when Jesus says in verse 13 that he wants his joy to be fulfilled in us, he means that he wants the joy he has in his Father to be in us so that we would enjoy the Father the way he does" (John "Joy and the Supremacy Postmodern World" in The Supremacy of Christ in a Postmodern World (Wheaton, IL: Crossway, 2007), 71).of Christ in a Postmodern World (Wheaton, IL: Crossway, 2007), 71).



## **The Foundation Of Our Joy**

this joy to us is through "these things I speak" (John 17:13). These are His teachings; these are His doctrines. Meaning; the joy of Jesus Christ, which He wants to convey to us, which He wants you and me to have are based on **his doctrinal teachings.** 

The foundation of our joy, then, is the doctrinal teachings of Jesus alongside his historical experience. I want to get you to anchor your feet onto this solid foundation, so that your joy indeed is a solid joy. Listen, there is no other way to attain Christ-exalting joy but to trace back what Christ taught us by His words and deeply plant our feet in His teachings.

Solid doctrine #1—**He is God, I'm not!** This doctrine needs to be unshaken, unmoved; you cannot misconstrue this, you've got to maintain this—**He is God, I am not.** The moment I think I'm God, goodbye joy! I become worried sick! The moment I try to control things I don't have control over—I become angry, manipulative. Hey, let God be God! He's the sovereign, you're not!

Solid doctrine #2—**God is a joyful God.** Within the Trinity, there is great joy already. Within the Trinity, there is perfect fellowship. Within the trinity, there is great love!

Solid doctrine #3—God created us out of the fulness of His joy in order to display the beauty of His manifold perfections. If you've been a Christian who has read your Bible more than once, you'll start to say, hmm, yeah, I know that. That sounds familiar. I've heard that before. Paul's language is replete with this doctrine—God's purpose is to make known the riches of his glory (see Romans, Colossians, 2 Corinthians). In Ephesians 1:3-14, he waxes the most eloquent! Here's a snippet of it. God did this. God did that "to the praise of his glory"!

There's many more solid doctrines for *The Foundation of Our Joy.* Stay tuned.
